## Our Summer Party 2023 will celebrate the coronation of King Charles III

# A Money-box with a Square Tale...

In December 2022, Kim McCauley, living in Northern Ireland, started to research a Dr. Barnardo's Homes money-box she had purchased.

On the reverse were details of the former keeper and member of the Dr. Barnardo's Helpers League, Miss M. Beard. It also included details of the donations collected in the box, between 1943 and 1946, paid to the League annually. It also records that Miss Beard was living on Britannia Square at the time.



Kim's search led her to the BSRA website, where she discovered that Miss Beard was living with her father, the Reverend Beard, at 50 Britannia Square until the 1950s.

Previously, in 1922, the property had become the vicarage of St Mary's church, occupied by Reverend Herbert Gresley Elton MA (Oxon). Several succeeding vicars are recorded: Rev. Samuel Wallis Frost, Rev. Gilbert Lionel Michell and, finally, Rev. Douglas Beard who lived here until the mid-1950s. Coincidentally, prior to Kim's contact, current resident John Ball had met Rev. Beard's daughter, who was able to offer interesting insights into her life growing up in a draughty old vicarage after the war, including descriptions of her mother growing potatoes in the garden under the 'dig for victory' scheme.

Following her detective work, Kim kindly contacted us to tell us about the money-box and its time on the Square. She was also able to send some very nice photographs. Thanks again to Kim for tracking us down.

Money-boxes like this were used to collect donations to help fund Dr. Barnardo's Homes orphanages and were a common sight in shops and schools until the 1960s and the expansion of the welfare state, when the organisation started to concentrate on residential services. Work continued in the 1970s offering fostering and adoption services along with family centres to support families in deprived areas. In the 1980s and 1990s with the support of President Diana, Princess of Wales, they developed new ways of working with children and young people, including pioneering work supporting survivors of child sexual abuse and children affected by HIV and Aids.

# Gull Report – Spring 2023

**A**s previously reported, the gull control measures carried out over the last few years by Worcester City Council have resulted in a significant reduction in gulls causing problems in our area. New residents may not be aware of how many problems we used to have with gulls!

The Council has recently appointed contractors to carry out hawking, nest and egg removal and nest prevention proofing for the whole City. In our area the most noticeable thing residents may notice is that the falconer and his hawks will commence patrolling starting 17/04/2023. These patrols will initially be five times a week, reducing to three times in a month's time. This schedule is intended to deter the gulls from establishing territories in which to build their nests.

All of the known problem nest areas (in and around our tall chimneys) have now been protected with mesh cages (see photos) preventing the birds from building their nests. This proofing is part funded by the home owners contributing to the cost of the cage, the Council pay for the access with cherry pickers/scaffolding etc.


As in previous years the council is requesting residents to contribute to the significant cost of all these control measures. The Residents' Association has been asked to contribute £550 this year a very small increase above £540 which was our contribution last year. We will shortly circulate details and request that each household makes a contribution of £10.00 towards this work. It is essential that we remain vigilant or else the gulls will "recolonise" our area and we'll be back to square one!

# Spring Street Clean 2023

The City Council have agreed to help us again with a Street Spring Clean on Sunday 23rd April and Monday 24th April. We will be working around the disruption in Albany Terrace caused by Severn Trent Water works in order to maintain this annual initiative. All residents will be given an official notification by the Council and parking permit(s) for free use of the Pitchcroft and Croft Road Council car parks from 1pm on Sunday 23rd April until 7am on Tuesday 25th April.

Residents are asked to ensure their vehicles are moved away from Albany Terrace and Britannia Square by 3pm Sunday when they are all invited to clear weeds and litter from the pavements and kerbsides near their properties.

The Council will send street sweeping teams in on Monday morning to remove everything we have gathered up. It is intended that the gulley cleaning machines will also take advantage of the clear access.
